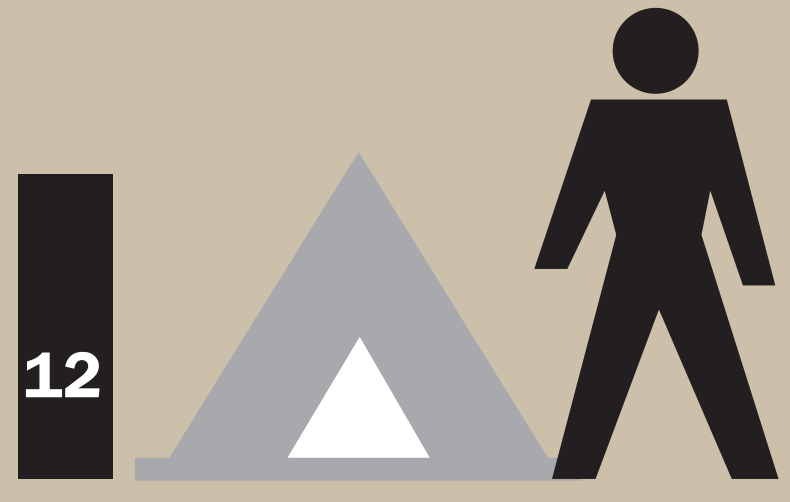


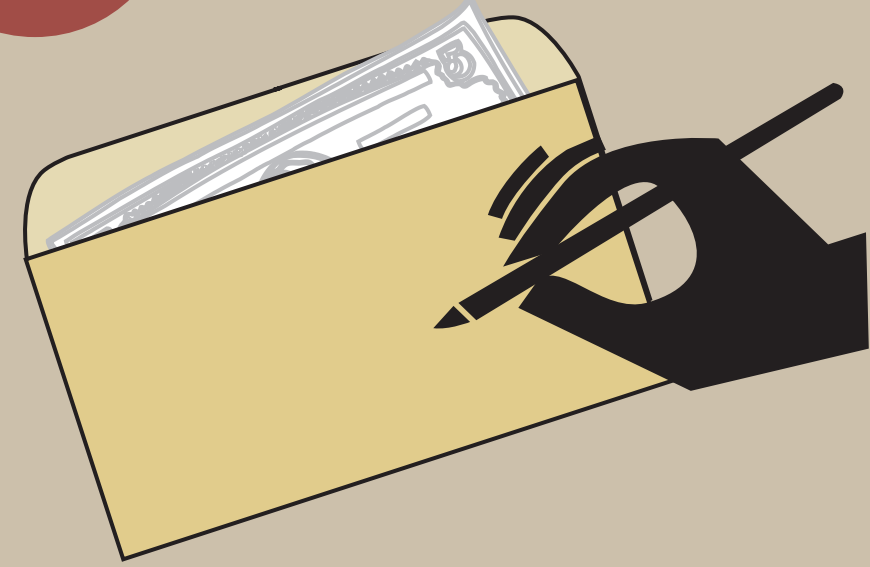
Welcome to Pine Flat Campground

DAILY FEE REQUIRED INSTRUCTIONS

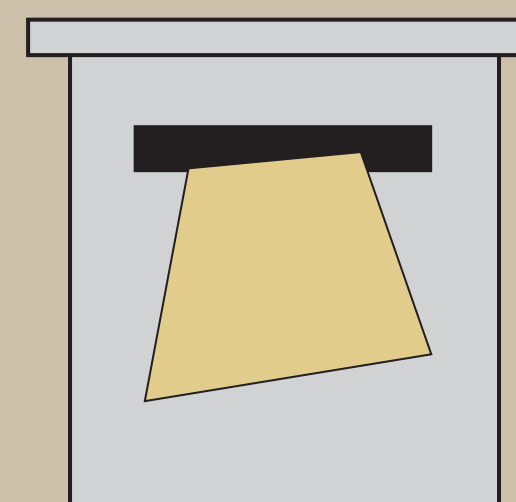
1 Occupy campsite, note number, return within 30 minutes.



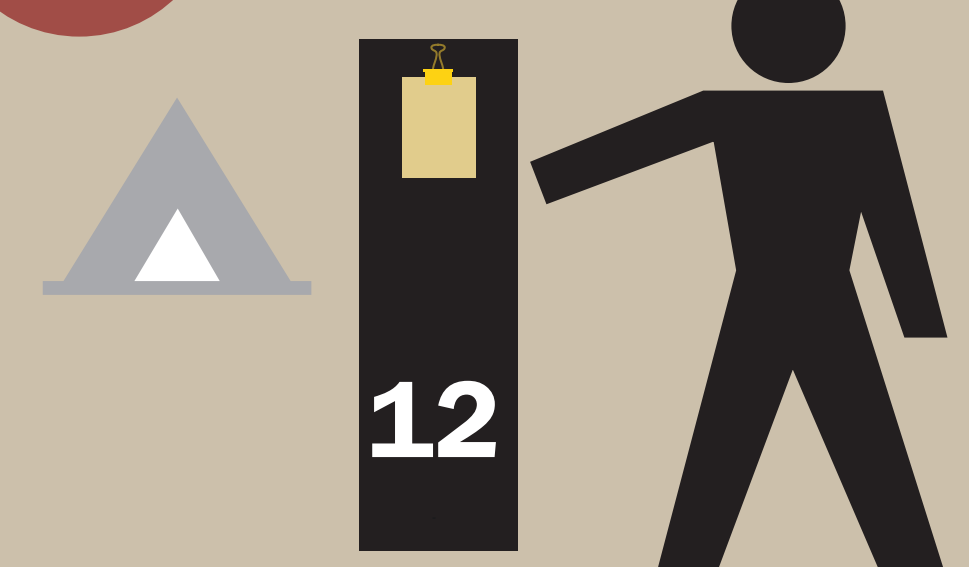
2 Fill out envelope and enclose fee.

4 Display detached stub on site post.

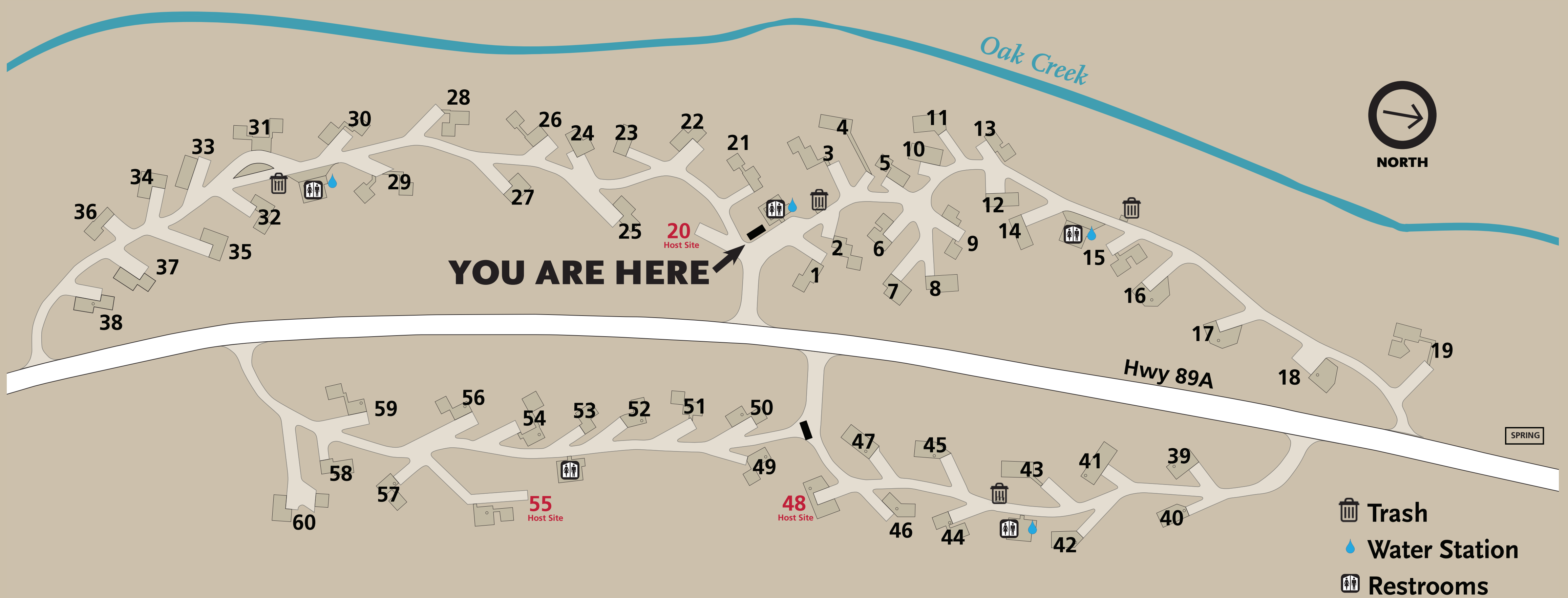

Pinyon Pine

Above the chaparral, on red sloping hillsides, **pinyon pines** mix with alligator and Utah junipers creating the widespread pinyon-juniper forest. Javelina, bobcat, and coyote roam this habitat, while ravens and red-tailed hawks soar above.



Manzanita

Manzanita is one of many shrub species found in the chaparral vegetative community. Other plants found in the chaparral are shrub oak, sugar sumac, and beargrass.
